Jim Hoorman was an Ohio State University Extension Educator for 24 years specializing in soil health, cover crops, water quality, nutrient management, soil ecology, sustainability, and economics. Hoorman Soil Health Services specializes in teaching soil health concepts, consulting with farmers on soil health practices, selling cover crop seed and biological enhancers, writing and conducting grants, and conducting soil health research.

About the Demo Farms:

Featured farms are long term no-till. One farm has been a corn and bean rotation with some cover crop, mainly cereal rye. The other farm is a three crop rotation, corn, beans, wheat with cereal rye and red clover used for cover crops used on most. The three crop rotation fields have also had manure applications.
